Senate Bill 1383 (2016)

Requires California Air Resources Board to implement the short-lived climate pollutant strategy to **reduce methane emissions by 40 percent**

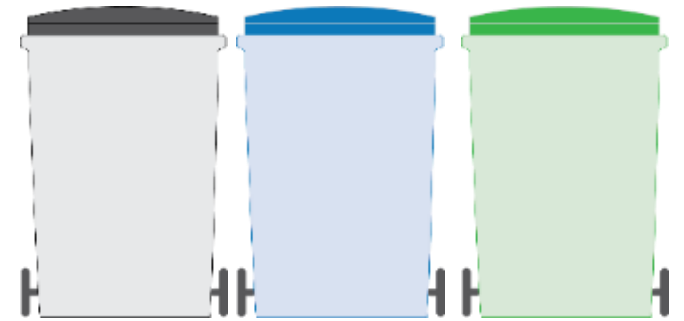
Requires CalRecycle to develop regulations to achieve the following **organic waste landfill disposal reduction targets:**

- 2020 - 50% reduction in statewide disposal of organic waste
- 2025 – 75% reduction in statewide disposal of organic waste
- 2025 – 20% of edible food that is currently disposed recovered for human consumption



Regulatory Requirements

- Mandatory organic waste collection services
- Education and outreach
- Organic waste recycling capacity
- Procurement of recovered organic waste products
- Edible food recovery programs
- Monitoring and enforcement including mandatory minimum penalties of \$50-\$500 per violation
- Penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for local jurisdictions



Timeline

- **January 2019** – CalRecycle released first formal draft regulations for 45-day comment period.
- **June 2019** – CalRecycle released second formal draft regulations for 30-day comment period.
- **September 2019** – CalRecycle released the third formal draft for a 15-day public comment period.
- **January 2020** – CalRecycle adopted the regulations.
- **March 2020** – The Office of Administrative Law (OAL) issued a Decision of Disapproval on the regulations.
- **April 2020** – CalRecycle released the fourth formal draft for a 30-day public comment period.
- **September 2020** – CalRecycle deadline to resubmit regulations to OAL.

Changes in the Fourth Formal Draft

- No mandatory penalties for container contamination
- Deadlines for enforcement shortened and streamlined
- Annual reporting deadline clarified
