Background

Fire Name: Lake Avenue Fire  
Date of Fire: July 9, 2006  
Burned Area: 5 acres  
Location: Near the intersection of Lake Avenue and Loma Alta Drive in unincorporated County of Los Angeles territory. Refer to Thomas Guide Page 536-A3 (2003 Edition). The burned area boundary is plotted on Attachment A.

Summary of Potential Sediment Impact

On July 24, 2006, Water Resources Division staff conducted a field reconnaissance on the burned area looking for residences and/or County facilities that could be potentially impacted by flooding/debris flows during storms. During a design storm event (50-year frequency), debris material will flow directly into the low lying region at the mouth of the canyon with no adverse debris flow impacts anticipated. There are no County facilities or residents which could be impacted by storm produced debris flows.

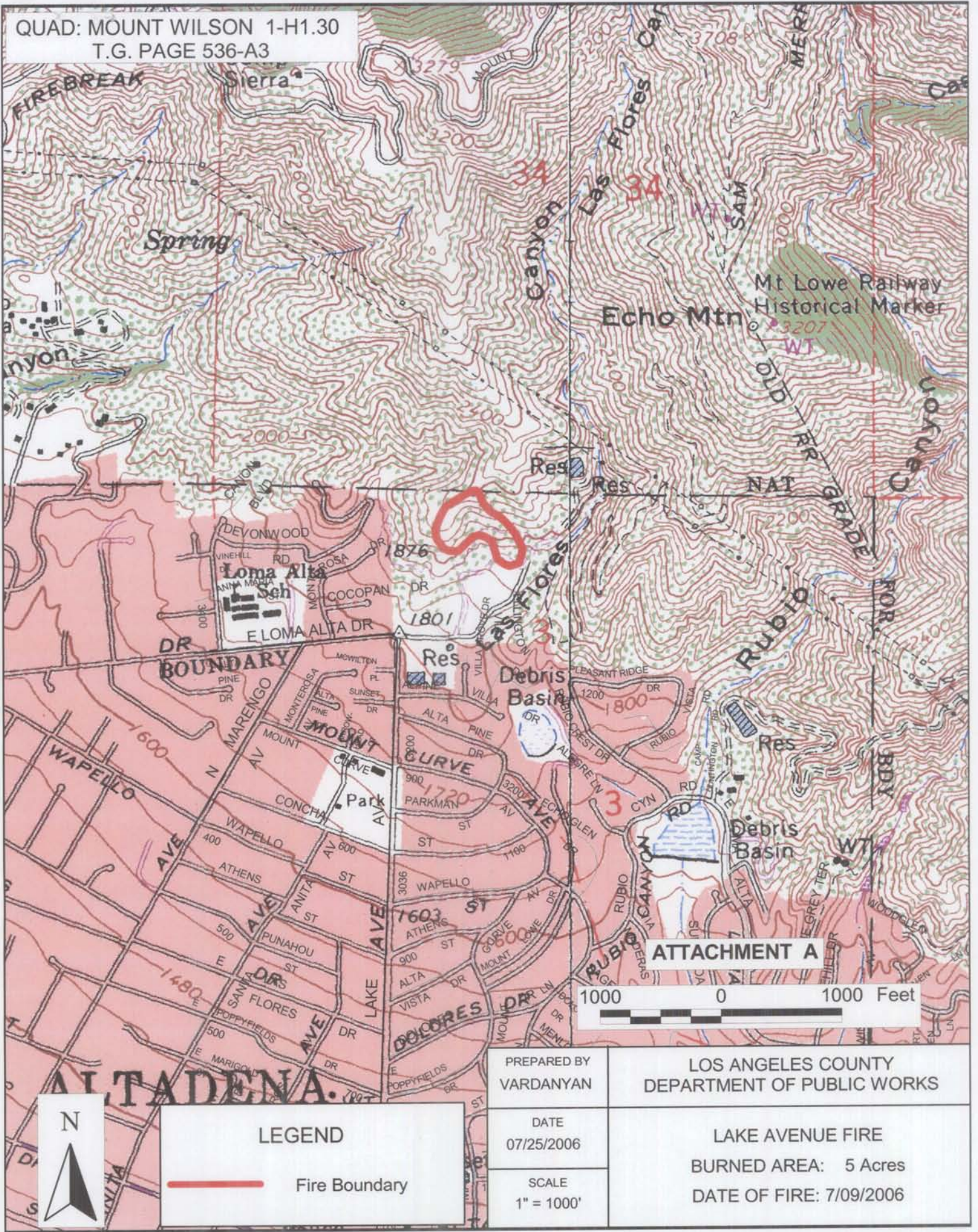
